Labor market information resources

Employment projections from DEED's Labor Market Information (LMI) office point to continued demand for manufacturing workers in the state, with more than 75,000 openings expected through 2030.

Nearly 325,000 Minnesotans are currently employed in manufacturing occupations. That's about 11.3% of total employment in Minnesota.
